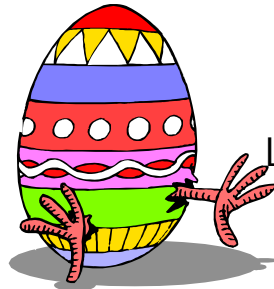


REMINDER LaCrosse Ord # 340

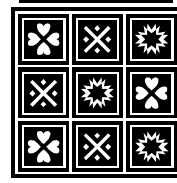
