March 13th: Seniors will begin selling Easter grams (delivery will be on Friday, April 3rd)



CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER'S CORNER by Roger Myers

Happy New Year to all! Please be sure to check for burn bans before burning. There are at least two ways to check for an alert. First, you can call Town Hall at 549-3330. Second, you can check the Washington State Department of Ecology's website by using the following 5 steps:

Step 1: www.ecology.wa.gov

Step 2: Go to the "I want to..." Section (the box on the first page with a green border around it)

Step 3: Click on the 4th arrow ("Check for burn bans")

Step 4: Scroll down to the "Stage 1 Burn Ban" Section (Yellow Rectangle on the left side of the page) AND scroll down to the "Stage 2 Burn Ban" Section (Red Rectangle on the left side of the page)

Step 5: Check to see if "Whitman County" is listed under the "County" Column in EITHER the Yellow OR the Red Section; if Whitman County is listed, then a burn ban is in effect and you must follow the "Start date/time" and the "End date/time," which means no burning during this timeframe

Please remember that outside and inside burning of household garbage is illegal. If anyone needs assistance hauling garbage to the county landfill, please let me know. I'm happy to help.

Also, I'm still working on relocating feral cats. Nineteen cats were relocated in December 2019. I have a lot more to go. If you have any questions, you can contact me at 549-3019 or email me at codeofficer@pionnet.com. Thank you and have a great New Year.
